



SYNEVIR

They grazed sheep and cows, cut down the forest.

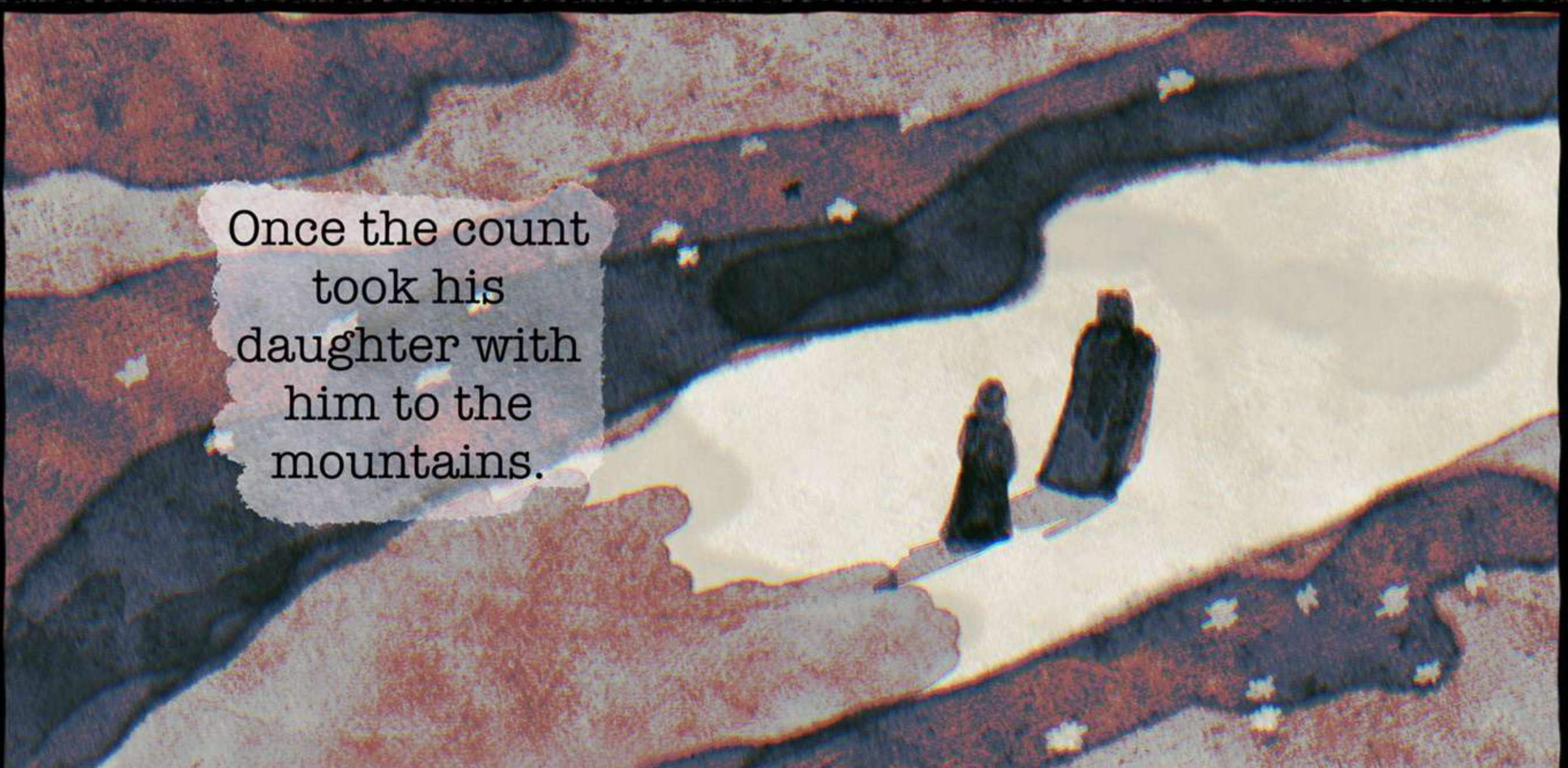




The count had a beautiful daughter Syn.



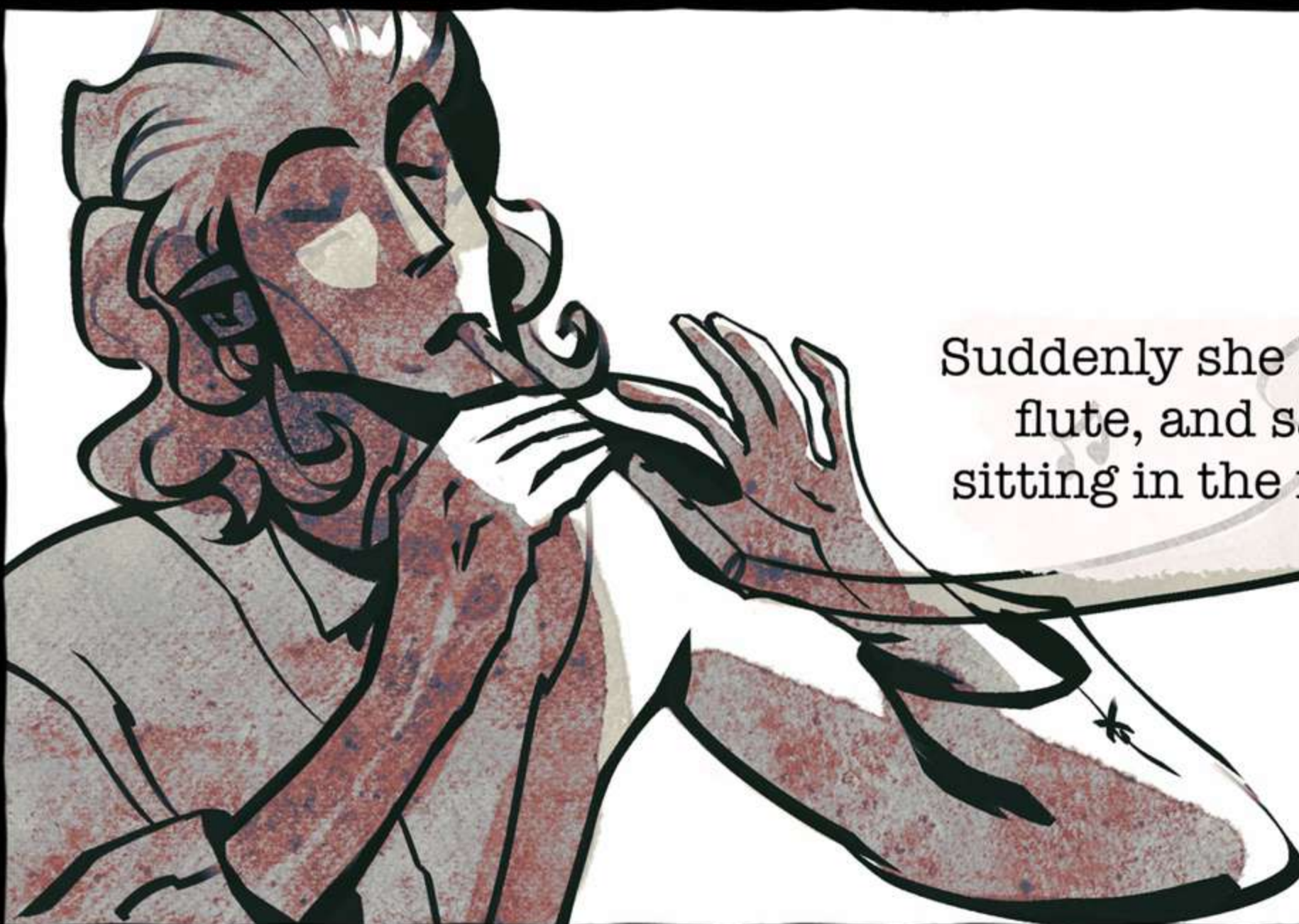
The girl was called so because her eyes were bluer than the sky itself.



Once the count took his daughter with him to the mountains.



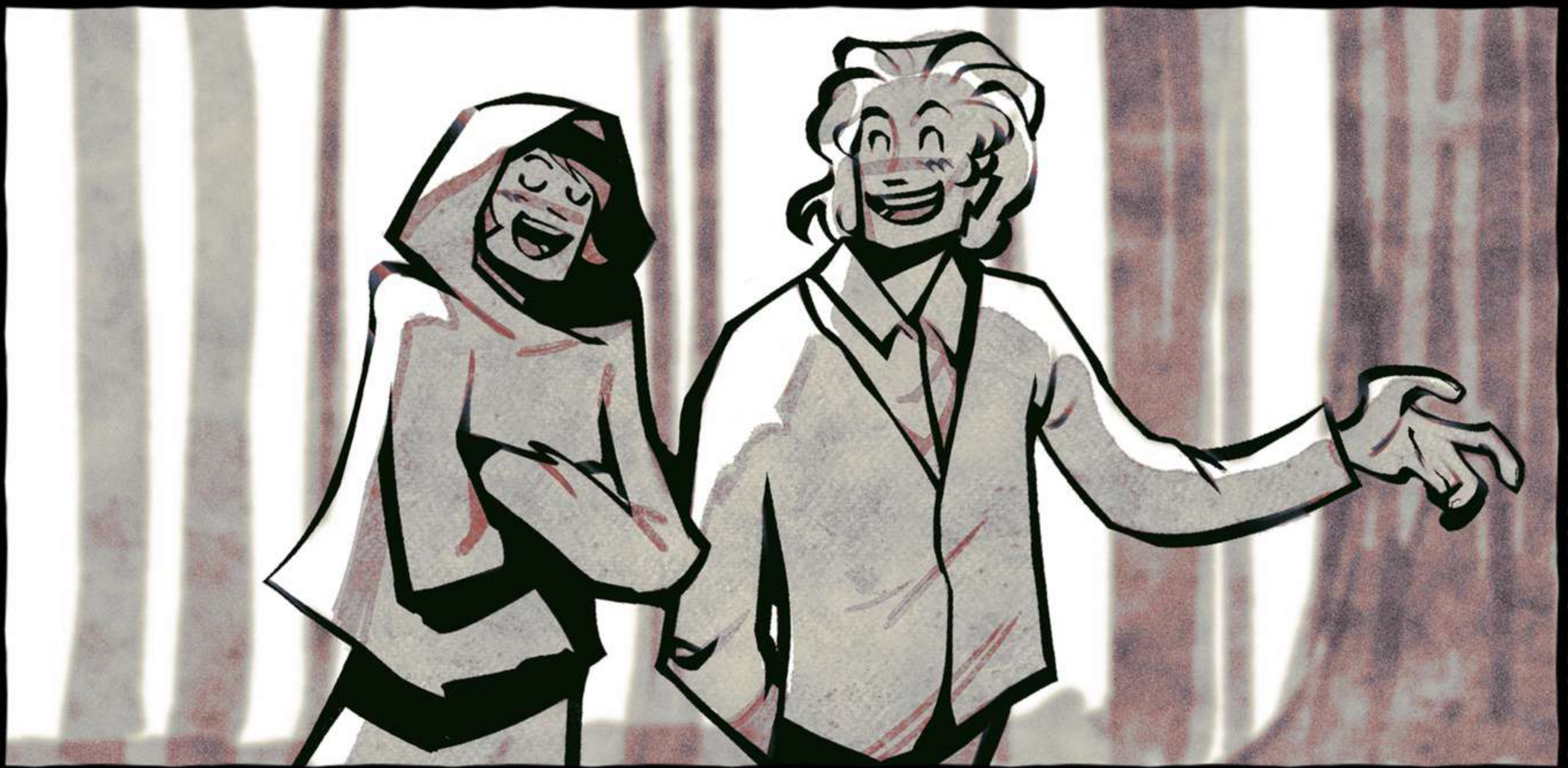
While the count was checking the work of the lumberjacks, the daughter was picking flowers in the clearing.

It was Vir, the shepherd. Noticing the girl, he stopped playing. That's how they met.

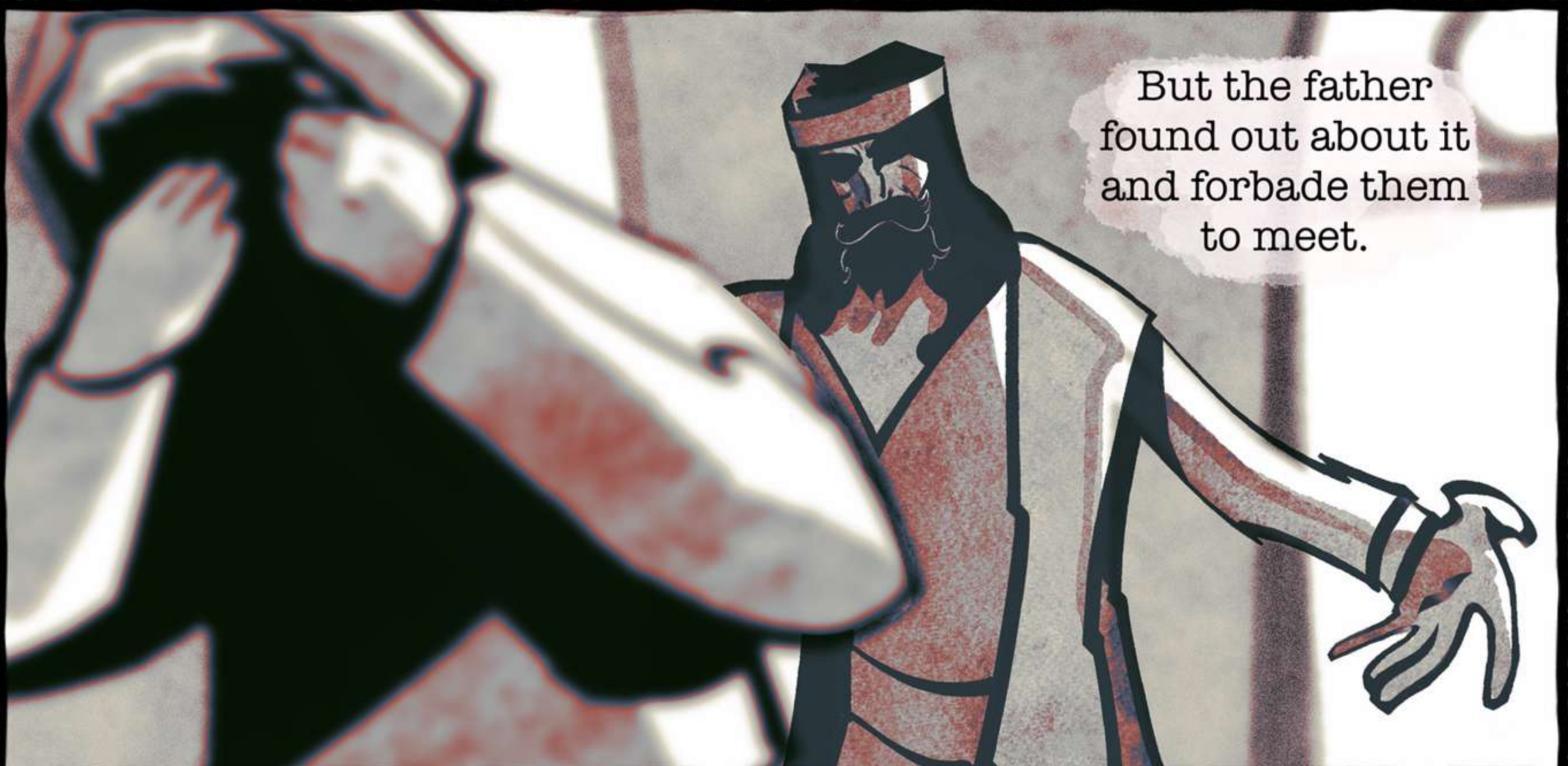


After that, the girl began to often come to the mountains to the shepherd.

But the father found out about it and forbade them to meet.



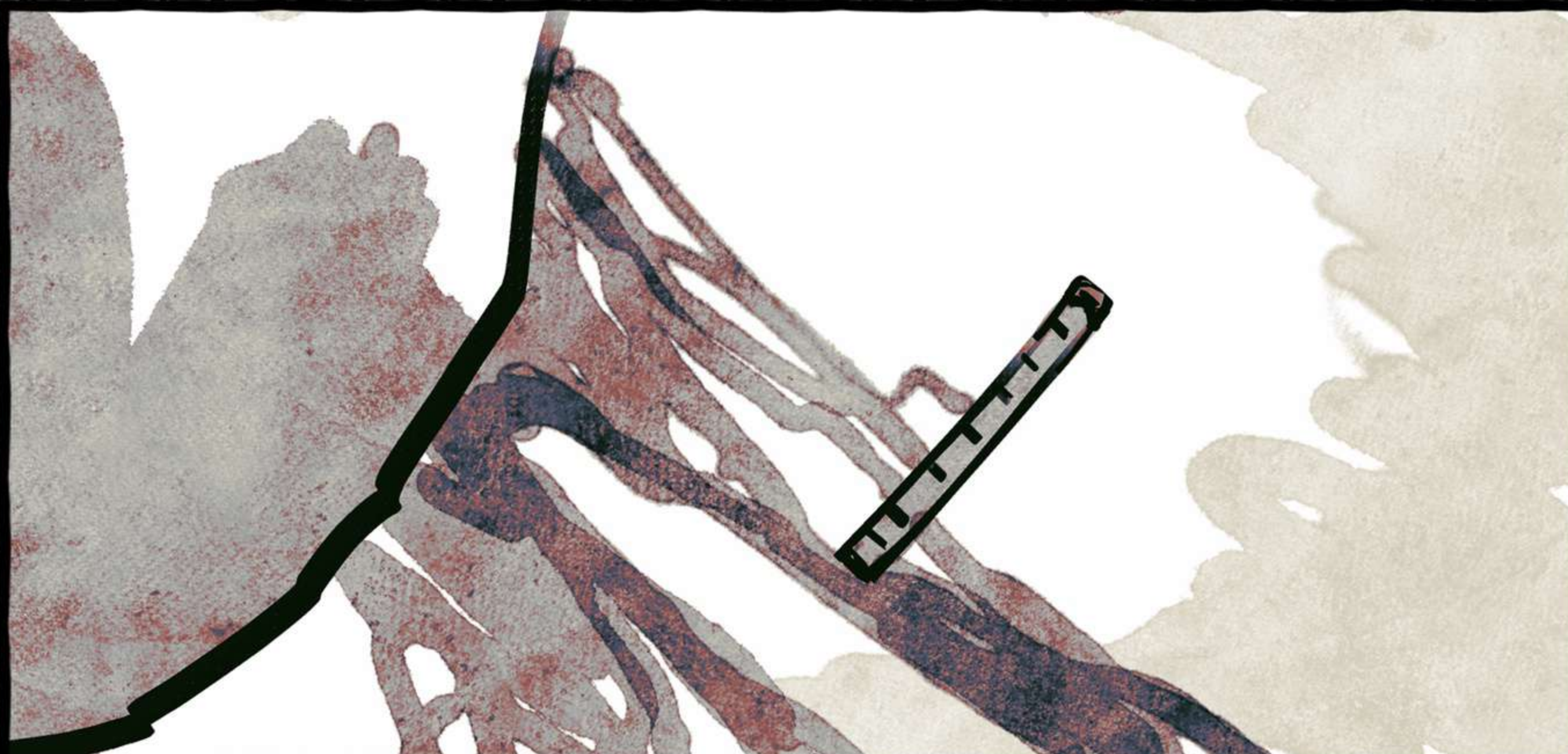
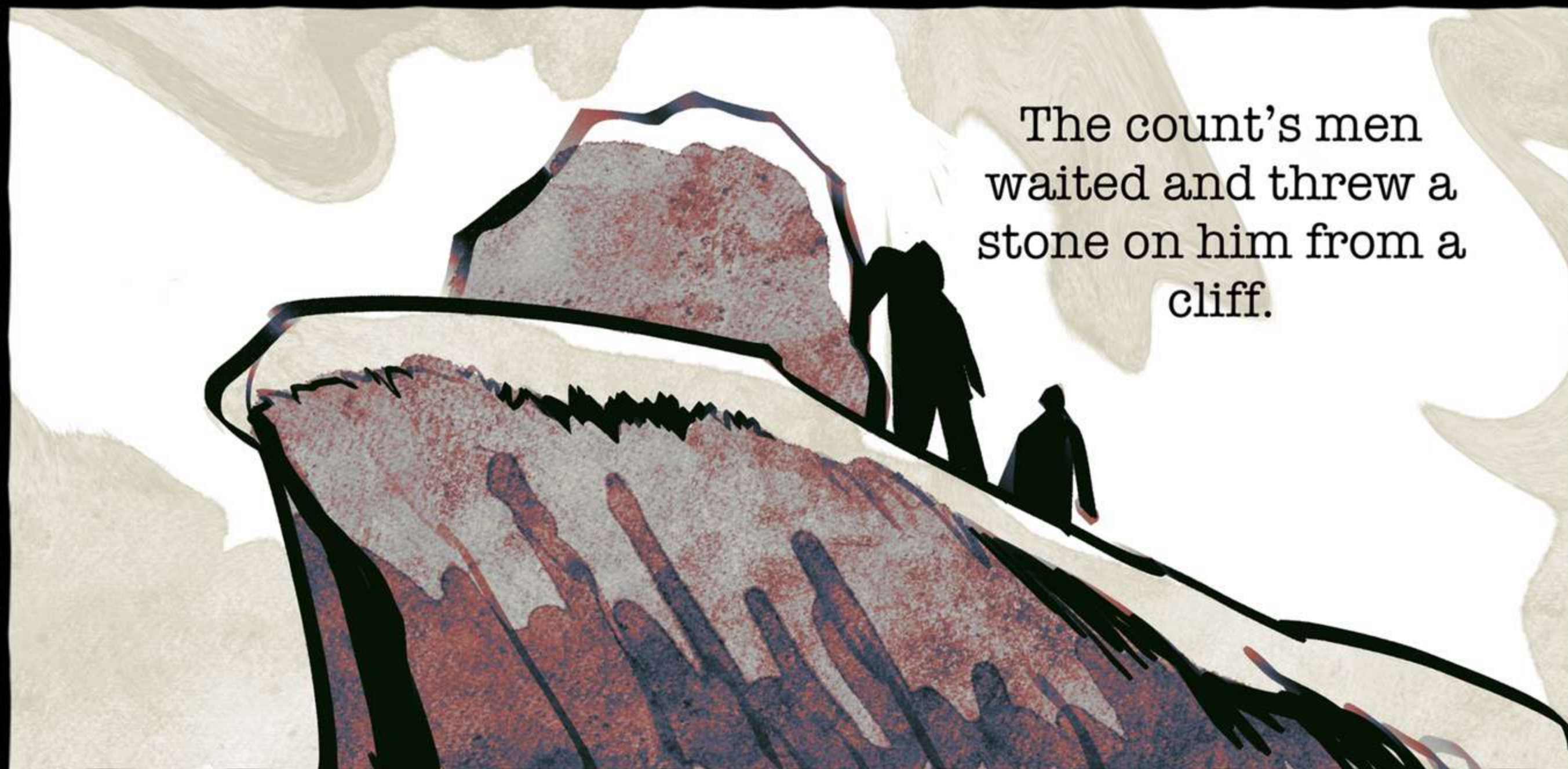
But they could no longer live without each other.



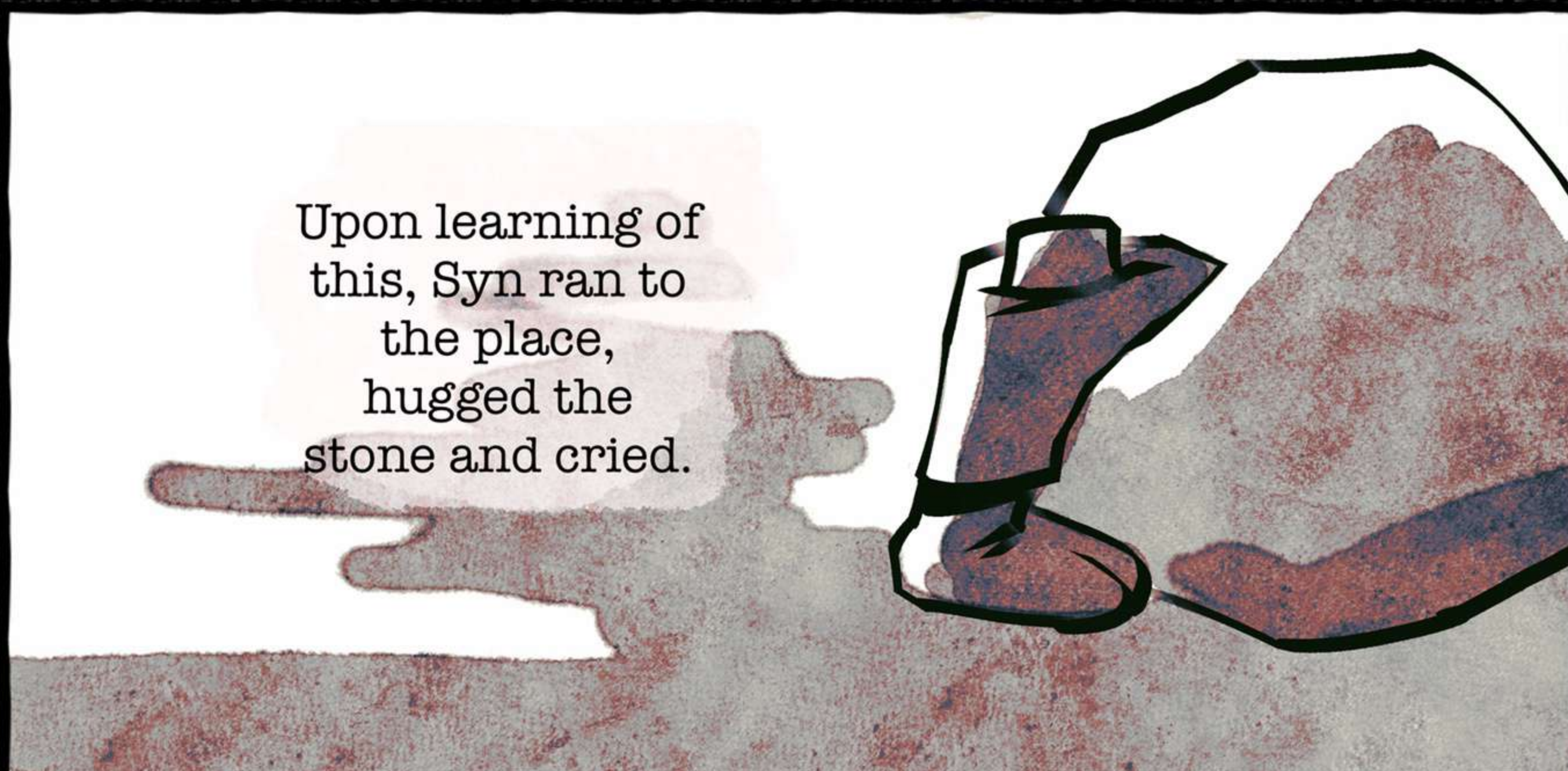
So the count ordered to kill Vir.

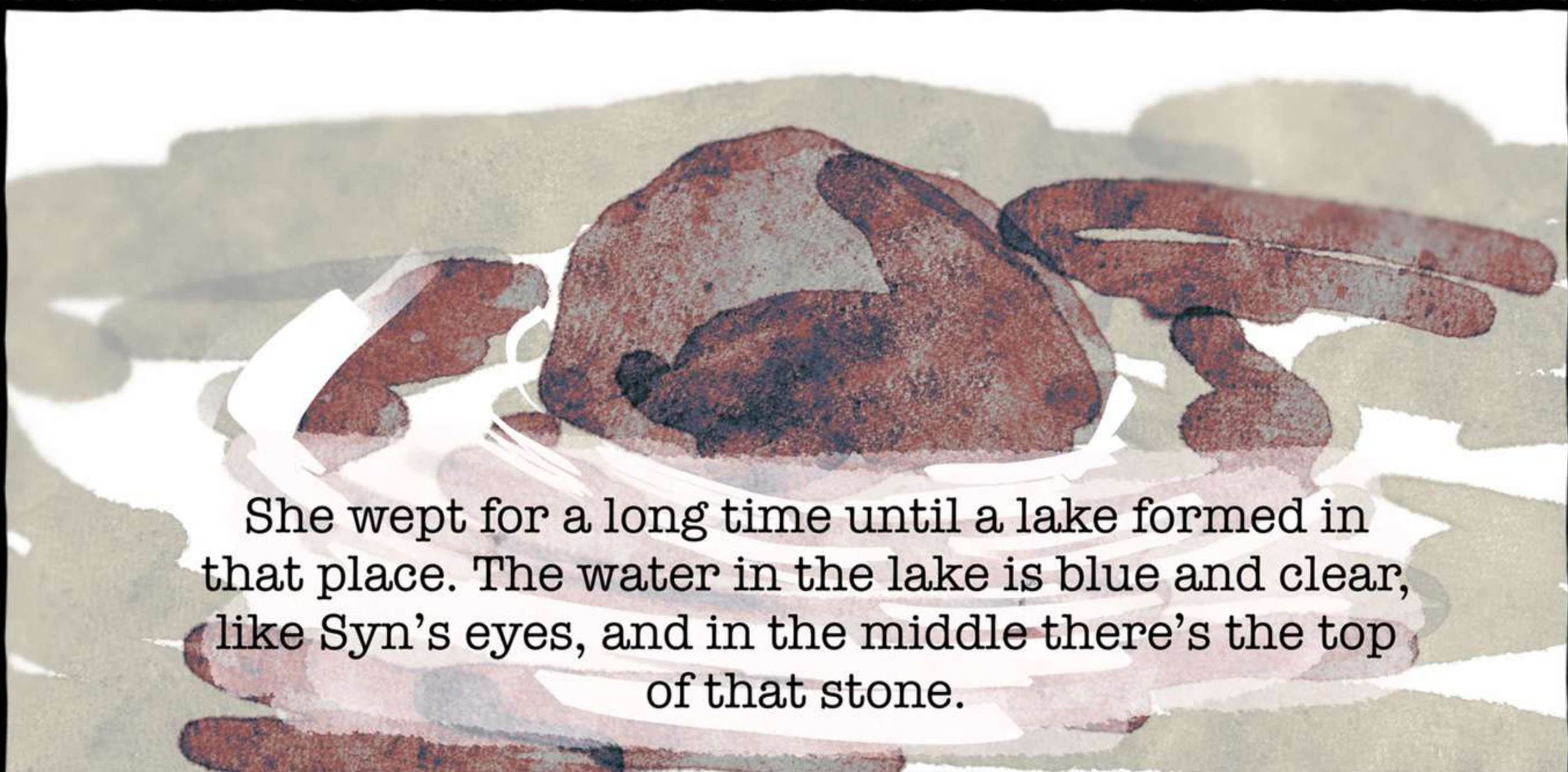
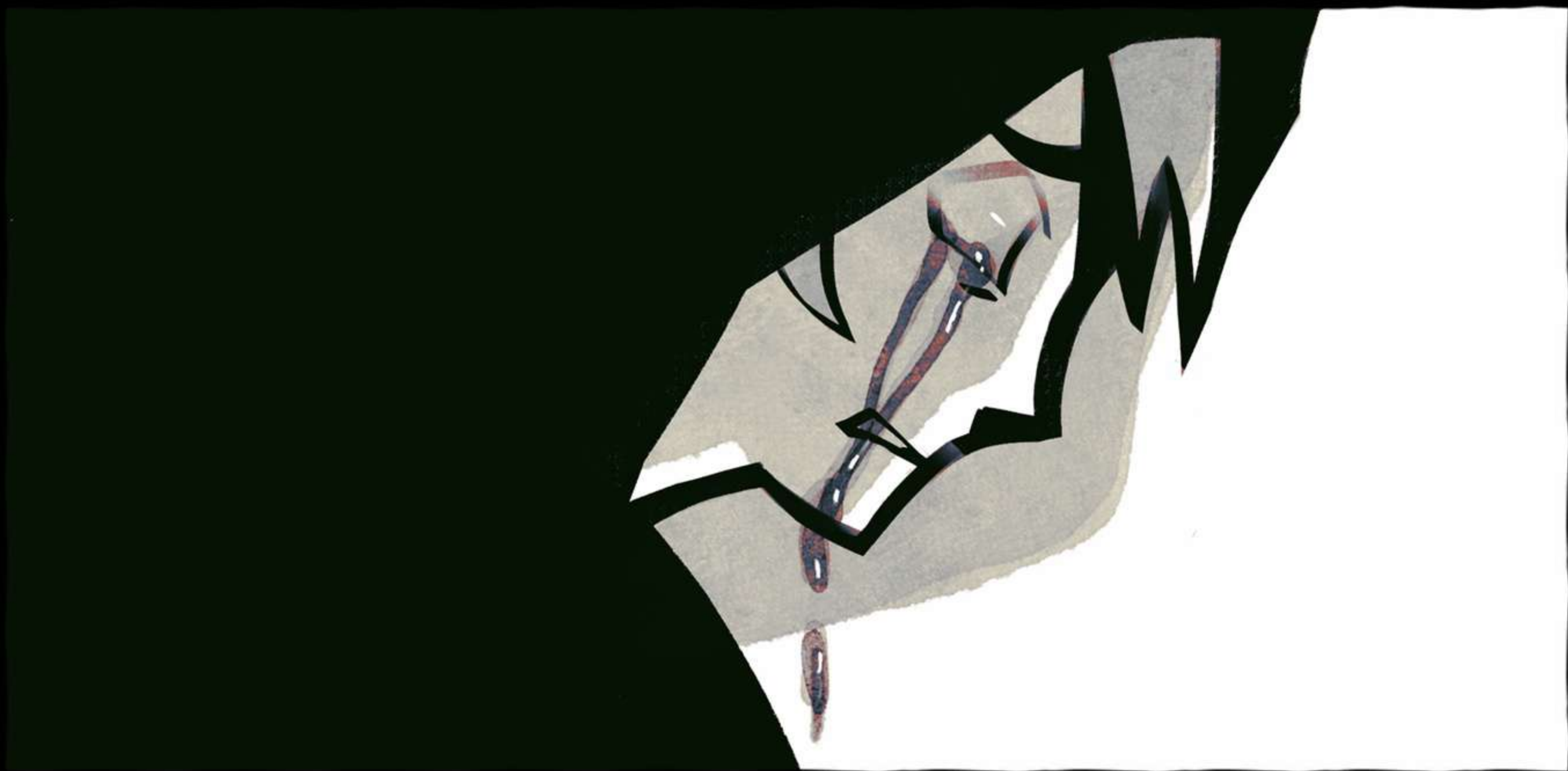


The count's men
